

TRANSPORT INFORMATION

THE UNDERGROUND NETWORK AND LIGHT RAIL NETWORK

MADRID REGION UNDERGROUND NETWORK
 Madrid Region Underground Network is 283 km long and 229 stations. Within the network there are different zones according to fares, in accordance with the segments indicated below:
MetroMadrid: All Underground stations including in Zone A
MetroSur: Line 12 (zones B1 and B2) and section of Line 10 between Joaquín Vilumbrales and Puerta del Sur stations (zone B1)
MetroNorte: Section of Line 10 between La Granja and Hospital Infanta Sofía stations (zone B1)
MetroEste: Section of Line 7 between Barrio del Puerto and Hospital del Henares stations (zone B1)
TFM: Section of Line 9 within zones B1, B2 and B3, between Rivas-Urbanizaciones and Arganda del Rey stations.
 The service operates between 6:00 a.m. and 1:30 a.m. everyday. Some stations have a special schedule.

MADRID REGION LIGHT RAIL NETWORK

The Madrid Region Light Rail Network, which is connected to the Underground Network, has a length 27.8 km and includes 37 stations and is made up of three lines:
 1 Pinar de Chamartín - Las Tablas
 2 Colonia Jardín - Estación de Aravaca
 3 Colonia Jardín - Puerta de Boadilla
 Light Railway Network travellers must obtain Single Tickets, 10-Trip Ticket and Single-Combined Tickets for the Underground and Light Railway Networks from the automatic vending machines installed in the entrances and exits of underground stations. Conductors on the Light Railway Network do not sell tickets for any network transportation.
 Light Railway Network travellers must have their tickets stamped in the ticket validation machines installed onboard the Light Railway trains, except in the underground stations, where tickets should be stamped in the turnstiles located at the stations' entrances.

FARES AND TICKETS FOR UNDERGROUND NETWORK AND LIGHT RAIL NETWORK

The Fares for the Underground Network and the Light Rail Network for 2009:
Single Tickets: MetroMadrid Single, MetroSur Single, MetroNorte Single, MetroEste Single, TFM Single, Single ML2 and Single ML3 it cost 1.00 €. Only usable in each one of its sections.
Combined Single Ticket: Combined tickets, in order to use in all Underground Network and Light Rail Network, it cost 2.00 €. **10-Trip Ticket:** 10-Trip Ticket Metrobús, 10-Trip Ticket MetroSur, 10-Trip Ticket MetroNorte, 10-Trip Ticket MetroEste, 10-Trip Ticket TFM, 10-Trip Ticket ML2 and 10-Trip Ticket ML3, it cost 7.40 €. Only usable in each one of its sections.
Combined 10-Trip Ticket: Combined 10-Trip tickets, in order to use in all Underground Network and Light Rail Network, it cost 14.50 €.

EMT BUSES: EMT

The Network of buses of the EMT in Madrid is formed by 209 routes, including the university routes, the special services routes and the night bus routes.
 The timetable depends on the route: generally, bus service operates from 6:00 h.a.m. to 11:30 p.m. A night service, called Búho "owl", comprises 24 routes.
 On weekends and days prior to public holidays, a "MetroBúhos" bus service composed of 11 lines will cover the routes of Madrid's Underground Network, and a bus service of three lines will cover the MetroSur routes during the Underground's closing hours, between 1:30h and 6:00h in the morning.
There are two ticket types:
 - Single ticket, valid for a single trip on a bus route. It cost 1.00 €. Can be purchased directly on the bus.
 - 10-Trip Ticket, it cost 7.40 €. Can be purchased at tobacconists, newsstands and Underground stations.

SUBURBAN RAIL NETWORK

The Suburban Rail Network in Madrid City comprises 30 stations, 15 stations provide direct connection to the Underground Network.
 The hours of operation may vary for the first and last routes between 5:30h and 23:30h, depending on the underground line and the day of the week.
 Three types of tickets exist: single ticket, ten-trip ticket and suburban rail monthly season ticket. Ticket prices depend upon the number of tariff zones crossed.

TRAVEL PASSES *** ABONO TRANSPORTES

Travel Passes are the most practical, convenient and economical way to get around and enjoy the advantages of Madrid's public transport system. There are several types of monthly travel passes:
 - Regular Pass: Valid for passengers between 21 and 64 years of age.
 - Youth Pass: Valid for passengers under 21 until the day of the year users turn 21.
 - Senior Pass: Valid for passengers of 65 years of age and older.
 Annual Regular and Annual Senior Passes are also available. They allow for unlimited use on all bus lines, the commuter train network and the underground network, within the corresponding validity zone. From January 1, 2009, the fares for Monthly Travel Passes will be:

TOURIST TRAVEL PASSES

The Tourist Pass is the most practical, comfortable and economic way to travel around Madrid. Passes exit for 1, 2, 3, 5 and 7 days. Validity begins starting on the date the pass is first used.
 It is possible to choose between different geographic areas:
 - Zone A, covering virtually all the municipality of Madrid, enables the use of all transportation means within this zone.
 - Zone T, comprises all the public transport services of the Region of Madrid, plus its extensions to Guadalajara and Toledo. Tickets are not valid for the regional Renfe Operadora train services.
 The Tourist Pass is on sale in the Underground ticket offices. From January 1, 2009, the fares for Tourist Travel Pass will be:
